

Rule 44. Parenting Time/Shared Parenting

(A) Standard parenting time guidelines.

No Standard Parenting Time schedule can meet the needs of every parent-child relationship and therefore, the court encourages parties to submit parenting time agreements that will meet the specific needs of the parties' child and shall take into consideration the factors set forth in R.C. 3109.051(D).

The court has adopted a Standard Parenting Time Schedule to be used as a guideline for parents in drafting their own agreements. In the event the parties cannot agree, the court's Standard Parenting Time Schedule shall control. All parenting time schedules shall include a finding by the court that it is in the best interest of the child to order such parenting time. The Standard Parenting Time Schedule can be found at the juvenile court web site, in the juvenile court clerk's office and in the pro se clinic.

(B) Shared Parenting

If the parties are filing for shared parenting as defined in R.C. 3109.04(K), the plan the parties are required to submit to the court shall include provisions covering all factors relevant to the care of the child, including, but not limited to, provisions covering factors such as physical living arrangements, child support obligations, provision for the child's medical and dental care, school placement and parenting time.
